"Violence against women is an everyday reality, act now, always, and forever before its too late."

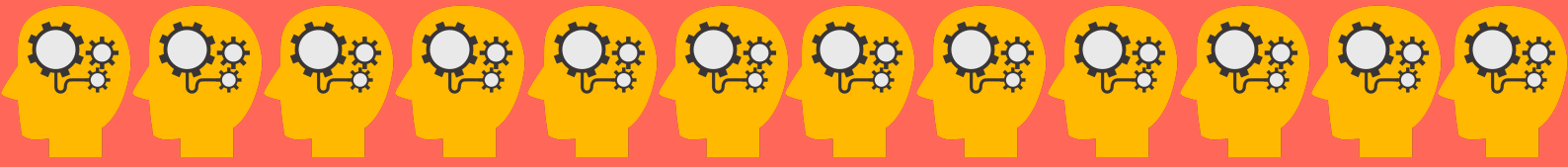
Ways to stop violence against women :

5. Share vital information with the community

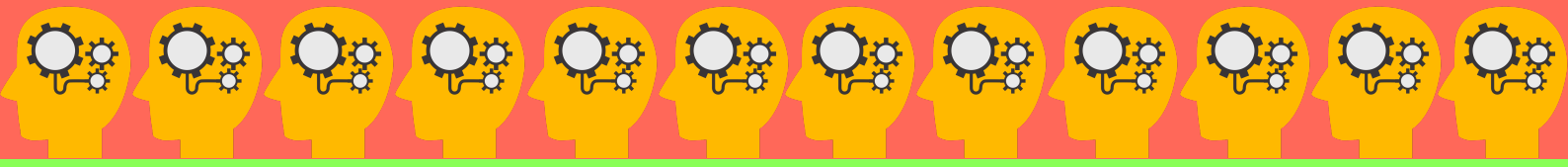

**World Science Day For Peace And Development**

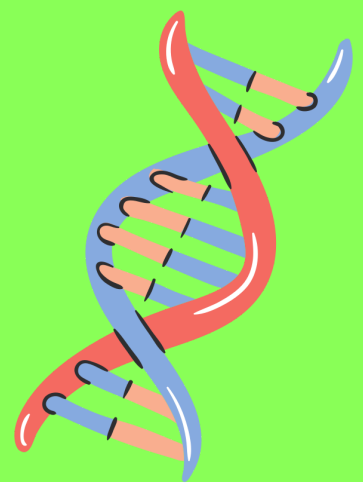
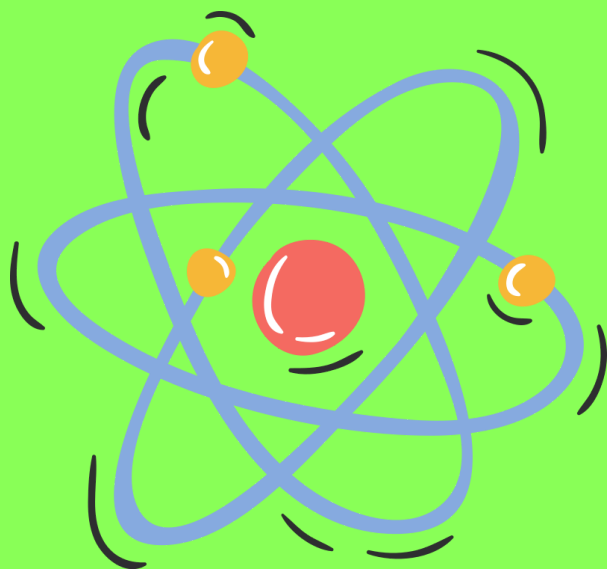
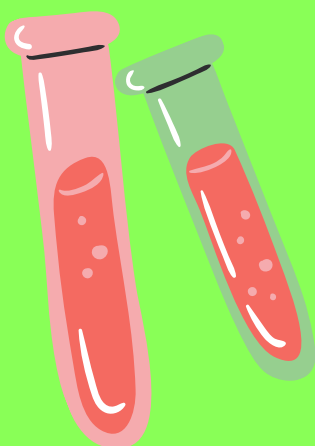

# DIWALI!

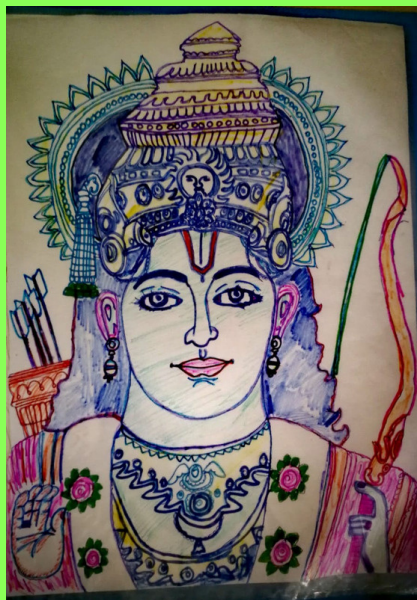
In India, one of the most significant festivals is Diwali. It is recognized as the Festival of Lights. Every region in India has many traditions for celebrating this festival.
