

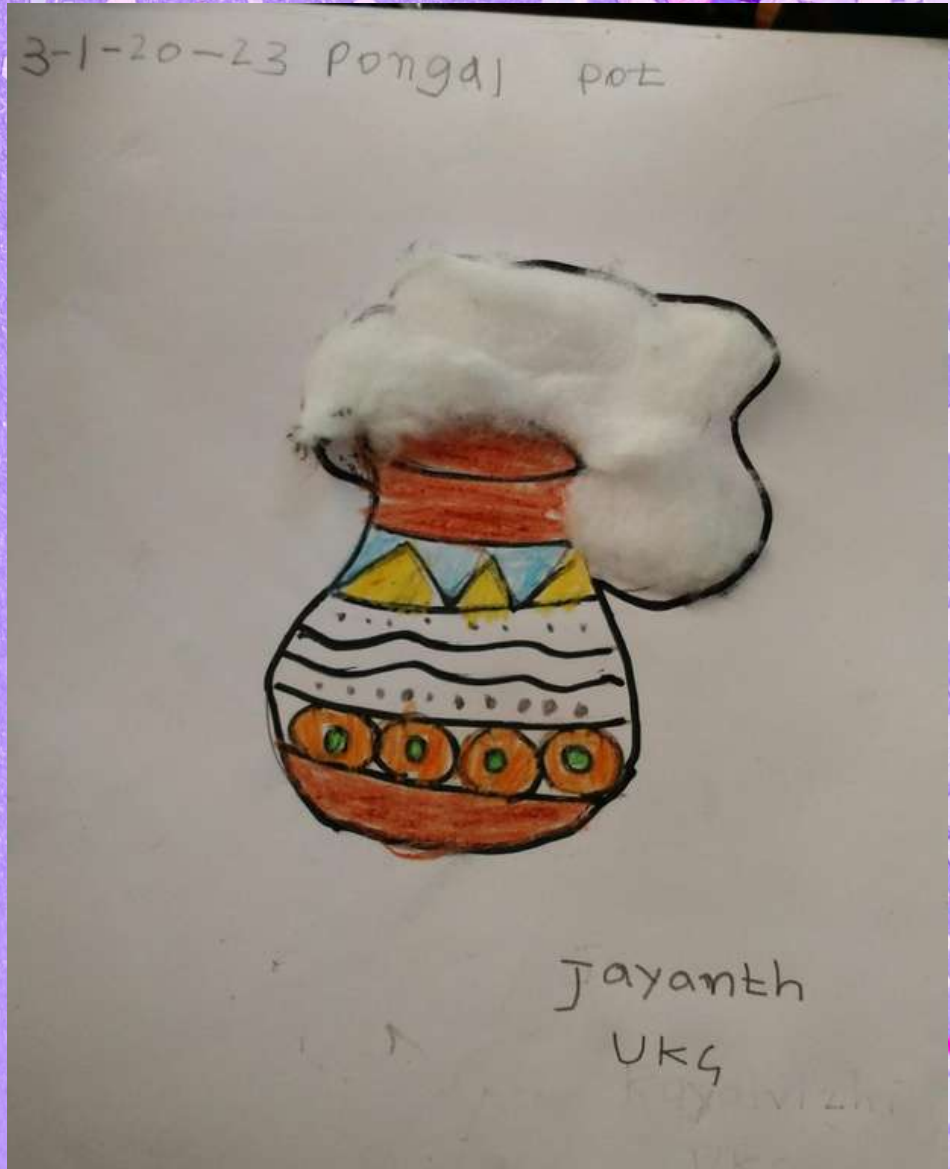

The Indian Army is the land-based branch and the largest component of the Indian Armed Forces. The President of India is the Supreme Commander of the Indian Army, and its professional head is the Chief of Army Staff (COAS), who is a four-star general.

Indian Army Day is celebrated in India every year on 15 January to recognize Field Marshal K. M. Cariappa, who became the first Chief Commander of the nation's Army on this day after the last British Army Chief officer Francis Butcher in 1949.

The day is celebrated in the form of parades and other military shows in the national capital New Delhi as well as in all headquarters.
