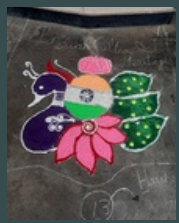
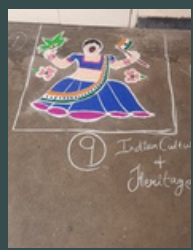
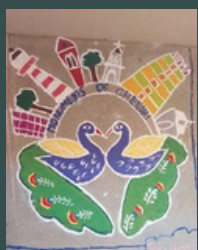
CELEBRATION

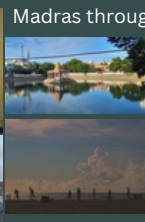

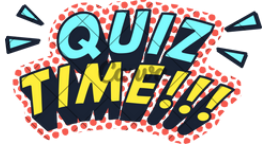
