Managing Trustee's Inaugural Address for the Academic Year 2025



The academic year began on a motivating note with a special address by our Managing Trustee, Shri N Kumar, to all faculty members on 5th June 2025. He appreciated the teachers' dedication and outlined the vision for the year ahead, emphasizing innovation, collaboration, and holistic student development. The session concluded with a call to embrace the new academic journey with passion and purpose.

Threads of Triumph – 2025 Board Results

We demonstrated stellar academic excellence in 2025, achieving a 100% pass rate in both the SSLC (Std X) and HSC (Std XII) board examinations—upholding the school’s proud legacy of academic distinction.

In the April 2025 SSLC Examination, all 98 students successfully cleared the exam, with 69 securing distinctions, 24 earning first-class, and 5 achieving second-class. Notably, the school recorded four centums in Social Science, and the top performer, Prathysha P V, scored an impressive 492 out of 500. In the March 2025 HSC Examination, all 130 students passed with flying colors. The Science stream was led by Suryaa E with 583/600, while Madhumitha S topped the Commerce stream with 581/600. The cohort earned 82 distinctions—62 in Science and 20 in Commerce—alongside 43 first-class and 5 second-class results. The school also proudly recorded five centums across subjects: Chemistry, Computer Science (2), Computer Applications, and Accountancy.

This remarkable achievement stands as a testament to the dedication of our students, the tireless efforts of our teachers, and the steadfast support of our parents—together reinforcing our commitment to academic excellence year after year.


Voices from the Deep: A World Ocean Day Special

"From Desks to Decisions – Your Voice Matters!"




"Chalking New Paths – IET Schools Host Their Maiden Intra-School Carrom Clash!"


Anti Drug Awareness






